### Yellowstone Announces a Major Upgrade to its Old Faithful WebCam

“Virtual visitors” to the Old Faithful Geyser WebCam page will find a greatly improved view of Old Faithful Geyser. New cameras at Old Faithful and Mammoth Hot Springs will provide larger and sharper WebCam images than ever before. The new Old Faithful Geyser WebCam was unveiled on Thursday, June 23rd.

This upgrade was made possible by the generous donation of two StarDot NetCam Megapixel Cameras. Stardot Technologies has supported the Yellowstone WebCam project since its inception and they are continuing their support with the recent donation of their Web cameras.

The larger, sharper images allow a much better view of eruptions of Old Faithful Geyser, as well as visitor and wildlife activities on and around the Mammoth Hot Springs Terraces. We will be keeping our original MammothCam in place because many visitors use it to wave to family and friends back home via the Internet. That is why visitors can often be seen on the WebCam talking on their cell phones and waving toward the camera.
